



COST SCENARIO: Heart Disease

Covered California health plans offer four metal tiers: Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Platinum. **Lower cost plans cost less per month, but mean more financial risk when you use your healthcare.**

Heart Disease Prevalence: Heart disease and stroke strike roughly 1.5 million people every year in the United States. Risk factors for heart disease and stroke, such as high blood pressure and high cholesterol, may not have any symptoms* and may only be revealed at a preventive care visit.

The table shows potential health costs, by Covered California metal tier, for a person who discovers during a primary care visit that they may be at risk for heart attack or stroke. The scenario includes routine diagnostics and medication, and does not involve an actual heart attack or stroke (which would significantly increase costs). This scenario focuses on one area of health costs, and does not consider other health costs a person might incur over the course of a year.
