

Find Affordable Healthcare Services Near You

This resource guide is designed to help people connect with affordable healthcare services and support available across California, regardless of insurance or immigration status. It includes information and links to community health centers, free and charitable clinics, county healthcare programs, and other local healthcare resources that may provide low-cost or no-cost services for eligible individuals.

Eligibility requirements, services provided, appointment availability, costs or payment options, and financial assistance may vary by provider, program, or county. Contact the provider or program directly to confirm current information.

Community Health Centers

Community health centers help people get healthcare, regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. Many offer low-cost sliding-scale fees based on income. Services may include primary care, preventive care, behavioral health services, dental care, prescription assistance, and other healthcare support.

Services vary by clinic and may include primary care, preventive services, specialty care, prescription support, and other community health resources.

Specialty Care Programs

HIV CARE PROGRAM

The **HIV Care Program**, administered by the California Department of Public Health Office of AIDS, helps people living with HIV get healthcare and support services if they are low-income and uninsured or underinsured.

Services vary by county and may include medical care, case management, mental health services, substance use support, health education, housing support, transportation, dental care, and food assistance.

Use the **HIV Care Program provider list** or the **Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Medical Provider tool** to find a provider near you.

EVERY WOMAN COUNTS PROGRAM

The **Every Woman Counts Program**, administered by the California Department of Health Care Services, provides free breast and cervical cancer screening and follow-up services for eligible low-income Californians.

MEDI-CAL ACCESS PROGRAM

The **Medi-Cal Access Program**, administered by the California Department of Health Care Services, provides low-cost comprehensive healthcare for pregnant persons for the duration of their pregnancy and up to 12 months postpartum. Newborns may be covered by the Medi-Cal Access Infant Program for up to two years.

FAMILY PLANNING, ACCESS, CARE, AND TREATMENT PROGRAM

The **Family Planning, Access, Care, and Treatment Program (Family PACT)**, administered by the California Department of Health Care Services, provides no-cost family planning and reproductive health services to eligible low-income California residents.

Free Immigration Legal Support

If you need legal assistance, various trusted organizations provide access to free, confidential immigration legal support.
